Application for Islamic Divorce

Important Information

Conditions for Processing the Case

- 1. The form must be filled out completely.
- 2. No fixed timeline is guaranteed; resolution depends on the case details.

Required Attachments

- Letter from the spouse describing the case in detail.
- Attach photocopies of valid IDs for both the husband and the wife.
- Attach a copy of Marriage Certificate.
- Civil Divorce Certificate (if already issued by a court).
- Any other supporting material such as photos, videos, or written records.

Terminology

This section explains some religious terms related to family issues that appear in the form.

These meanings are based on the teachings of the school of the Prophet's family (peace be upon them). Some scholars may have different opinions, so applicants should follow the rulings of the Marja' (religious authority) they follow.

- ➤ **Revocable (Raj'i) divorce:** This form of divorce is initiated by the husband. In the presence of two just witnesses, he declares with intent: "Zawjati taliq" (My wife is divorced). The wife remains legally married during the waiting period (iddah), and the husband may resume the marriage by showing verbal or physical signs of reconciliation, provided the iddah has not ended. During this period, the wife is to stay in the husband's home, and he is not allowed to force her out, nor may she leave without his consent. If she leaves unlawfully, she is labeled a *nashiz* (disobedient wife) and forfeits her right to financial maintenance (*nafaqah*).
- > **Mubarat divorce:** This divorce occurs when both spouses harbor mutual dislike, and the wife gives up ownership of certain property to obtain a separation. Reconciliation is not permitted without a new marriage contract, even if still within the 'iddah.
- ➤ **Khula' divorce:** In this case, the wife, due to strong aversion and fear of failing in her marital duties, seeks a divorce from her husband. She offers compensation (*bathl*), which the husband accepts, and thus the divorce takes place. Like mubarat, a new marriage contract is required for reconciliation, even during the 'iddah.
- > **Judicial divorce:** This type of divorce is granted by a qualified religious scholar when the wife files a complaint that the husband is neglecting her rights. The couple cannot reunite without entering into a new marriage contract, regardless of whether the `iddah is still ongoing.
- > **Iddah**: This is the waiting period a woman must observe after a divorce or the death of her husband during which she is not permitted to remarry. For divorce, this is because the marriage bond continues until the end of iddah; for a widow, it is also a mourning period.
- > **Iddah after divorce**: The woman must menstruate three times; once this occurs, her waiting period ends. The iddah starts from the time of divorce, not from when she becomes aware of it—even if that knowledge comes much later.
- > 'Iddah of a pregnant woman: Her waiting period ends when she delivers the baby.
- > 'Iddah for a woman who does not menstruate due to illness or another reason: Three months.
- > 'Iddah of a widow (not pregnant): She must wait four months and ten days from the day she finds out about her husband's death, even if she learns about it much later.
- > 'Iddah for a woman divorced by a religious scholar: She must see three menstrual cycles.
- > 'Iddah for a postmenopausal woman (ya'is): No waiting period is required.
- > 'Iddah for a woman who never consummated the marriage: No waiting period is necessary.
